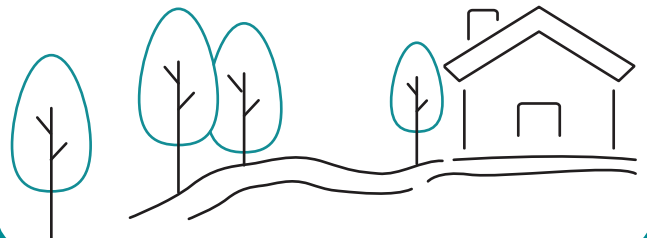
40% of LALCs surveyed

reported that NSWALC had **increased their opportunities** to take part in **cultural and heritage activities**.

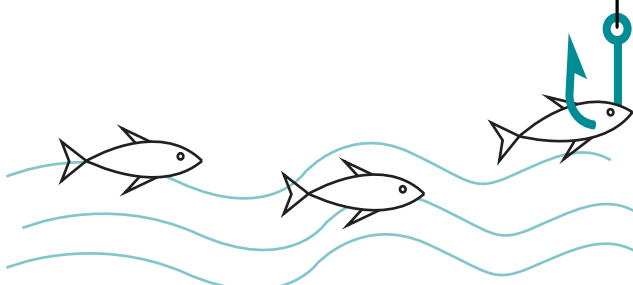


9,275 hectares of land

returned to 67 LALCs, and delivered **\$10.5 million** worth of repairs, maintenance and improvements to LALC housing.



Supporting **over 50 LALC businesses, 37 procurement opportunities** for Yarpa Indigenous Business Members and dispersing **\$1.7 million in funding** to support Aboriginal fishing businesses.



over \$3.3 million in grant funding provided to support LALCs and Aboriginal people across NSW including over **\$770,000 in funeral support funding**.
